

On March 17-18, 2021, an online pre-kickoff meeting was organized by the NEO in Armenia with the participation of the representatives from Armenian HEIs. The main objective of the meeting was to introduce the seven Erasmus + CBHE projects selected under the Call for Proposals 2020. The SMARTI Project was presented by Mrs. Tereza Khechoyan, PAARA Vice Rector for Foreign Relations, who briefly introduced the Project description, the main aims and objectives, planned activities, intended outcomes and deliverables. HYBRID COMBINED ANNUAL STEERING GROUP MEETING AND TRAINING

On October 6-8, 2021, Goris State University hosted a hybrid workshop on "Hybrid Combined Annual Steering Group Meeting and Training". On the first day of the workshop, the participants spoke about the monitoring conducted in Russia in June, 2021 and the upcoming monitoring which was to be held by the NEO-Armenia on 15 October, 2021. The next two presentations were devoted to the outcomes of the Field and Desk studies carried out by ANAU and PetrSU.

Then, the Armenian and Russian PC Universities succinctly presented the strengths and weaknesses of the ESP selfstudy manual "Headway", the mechanisms and strategies of the ECTS system implemented in their HEIs and the extent to which they are similar to or different from the guidelines and key features described in the "ECTS Users' Guide". Even the cold and foggy weather could not discourage the adventurous group from riding the <u>cable car</u> which is the longest non-stop reversible aerial tramway.


NEWS ABOUT EMI CENTRES

One of the most significant milestones of the SMARTI Project is the establishment of the EMI Centres in PC HEIs which will serve as a hub and a solid base for the efficient implementation of methods, techniques and strategies for the EMI activities in terms of organisation and content. The Centres are to be equipped with facilities and conditions conducive to ensuring a smooth flow of activities each of which will be a stepping stone to enhancing the standards of higher education and the internationalisation of the academic programs chosen for the project. The EMI Centres will provide training courses and give consultations on a regular basis to the subject teachers who are expected to conduct their academic disciplines in English with a strong emphasis on student-centred learning methodologies on the one hand and innovative approaches to research and teaching on the other hand.

Desk and Field Study in Armenia

The Desk and Field study was implemented at each Armenian PC university. It was conducted in the form of an online survey with 27 questions for representatives from 15 Armenian HEIs and an online follow-up student survey (14 questions) for students from 5 Armenian partner universities. The results of the field and desk studies show that there are still many gaps in the integration of the EMI concept, harmonized methodologies, the English language proficiency level of the staff and students using EMI. According to the outcomes of our research, the EMI programs in 87% of Armenian universities are in line with the ECTS system, which is an important indicator for further integration of EMI in Armenian HEIs. In 40% of universities there is no clear understanding of the EMI program concept and the prevailing false assumption is that the EMI program implementation merely presupposes the translation of subject-teaching materials from Armenian into English. As far as the main outcomes are concerned, the implementation of studentcentered technologies was highlighted as the most important approach to teaching through EMI. The main difficulties and problems students encounter include, but are not limited to, a rather low level of English language proficiency, a limited number and unacceptable quality level of EMI programs. The main language barriers for teachers are speech fluency, vocabulary and grammar.



SMARTI TEACHING AND LEARNING

The approach which is currently being exploited at VSU for non-English language subjects is CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning). This is a strategy which efficiently incorporates two types of English: GE (General English) and ESP (English for Specific Purposes). The latter is significantly important for students since language is functional and is dictated by the content of a specific subject. This job/careeroriented methodology develops students' communicative competence in their field of specialisation and provides them with skills necessary meet the 21st-century labour market to requirements. The lesson plan below (for students whose major is Physics) has been developed according to CLIL methodology in which both the language and the subject are cooperatively integrated.

CLIL-Approach Implementation at VSU

General English (GE)

- Vocabulary: Career Moves
- Grammar: Modals: Ability, requests and offers
- Reading: Ten ways to improve your career
- Speaking: Discussing ways to improve your career
- Communication Skills: **Telephoning: Making** contact

English for Specific Purposes (ESP) Topic: The Properties of Plasma: nucleus of one proton, positive charge, ions and electrons, the remnant of a molecule, completely ionized, discharge, electrically neutral

- Vocabulary: Professional terms related to Plasma Physics: thermonuclear fusion, heating and confinement, experimental equipment and installations, hydrogen ions, closed magnetic system
- Word Formation: (molecule-molecular)
- Speaking: Pair-discussion on industrial applications of Plasma Physics
- Writing: A report on Plasma Physics and its applications



QUALITY ASSURANCE OF THE SMARTI PROJECT EVENTS

The continuous quality assurance process is essential for the success of the STMARTI Project. Within the framework of the Project the Internal Evaluation Working Group (IEWG) has been set up with one representative from each of the following project-partner institutions: Armenian National Centre for Professional Education Quality Assurance.



Foundation (ANQA), Russian Register (RR) and Riga Technical University (RTU). IEWG has started its activities with the evaluation of the SMARTI project kickoff meeting; in close cooperation with the partners, it has developed and implemented an evaluation survey for the Desk and Field Study. IEWG has also held several meetings to develop the Quality Assurance Strategy (QAS) which was finalized during the <u>off-line meeting in Yerevan (October, 2021)</u>.



The QAS, based on the PDCA (plan-do-checkact) cycle, involves the main steps of the Project quality assurance activities and aims at its constant Within improvement. the framework of QAS, IEWG initiated the progress reporting procedure for all the Working Packages.
